Report of the President

For the Year Ended April 30, 2005

The President of Oak Hill Cemetery herewith submits his Report for the year ended April 30, 2005 along with the Report of the Treasurer.

It is with deep regret that I announce the death of Superintendent Joseph Pozell who was killed in a traffic accident at Wisconsin Avenue and M Street while directing traffic as a reserve police officer. During Joe's 20-year tenure, the care of the grounds vastly improved. He established a fine working crew who will carry on his plans for Oak Hill. Joe Pozell will be sorely missed. The Board has appointed Joe's wife Ella as Superintendent.

Unfortunately, I have to announce the death of our former Board member Lesley Burchell McFarland on February 13, 2005 who, during her term, organized the Friends of Oak Hill.

Still further, we received news that Mrs. Marian Collier, wife of our former Superintendent John Collier died on May 16, 2005.

IN MEMORIAM

Joseph Pozell

May 10, 1946 - May 17, 2005

March 1, 1984 was an auspicious day for my husband Joe. On that day he began work at Oak Hill Cemetery as a groundskeeper hired by then-Superintendent George Kackley.

The groundskeeping crew was small then as it is today, but Joe threw himself into the work and met the challenge of maintaining the steep terraces with vigor. He had, after all, been born in West Virginia and had had his own landscaping business Georgetown Gardens in Georgetown; so he was adept at maintaining "hills". Each day when he came home, he would tell me of the accomplishments of that day.

In July, 1985, Joe and I moved into the cemetery gatehouse with our six-year-old son Joseph. After Joe became Superintendent, I continued my work in the office. Although Joe was Superintendent, he spent little time in the office. He continued to work on the grounds for about two years, and gradually the well-maintained cemetery that you see today evolved. Joe's passion for this sacred place grew. Finally, Joe began dividing his time between the office and the grounds. As our wonderfully adept grounds crew totaled four, they began working on their own under Joe's supervision, and Joe began to focus on office matters.

With the Board of Managers' support, Joe's ideas for improving other aspects of the cemetery flourished.

As is the case with many other older cemeteries, we had lost contact with many families through dispersal, disinterest and death. Joe created a form for visitors to complete when they came here to visit graves or research their ancestors. Their lot number was noted on the form.



Joe's goal was to have at least one contact for each of the more than 2,000 lots and sites.

As the names of visitors were added to our records, Joe suggested that we purchase computers so that he could start a database to

keep track of our families. After he began the database, he suggested that we create a newsletter as a way of keeping them informed and interested in Oak Hill. He maintained the database and updated it almost daily as new families purchased sites and descendants of original lot owners made themselves known to us. The newsletter contained a donation envelope, and checks began to trickle in, but now our numbers have swelled. Joe always hoped that those who had been on the mailing list since its inception in 1991 but never contributed would do so. That was still his goal at the time of his death, and he tried to think of ways to pique their interest.

The last 10 years have been especially challenging. Prior to the disastrous rainstorm in August, 2001, we had become aware that the infrastructure was failing in some areas. In the summer, 1995 newsletter, Joe mentioned in an article that one of our lotholders, David deVicq, was going to work with him to assess our drain problems. David, a civil engineer, our crew and Joe explored the system and began to uncover and clear drains inlets. In August, 2001, the devastating rainstorm compromised two tiers of graves that overlook Rock Creek. As a result, all donations (and endowment) were used to fund the very expensive project to shore up those tiers.

Throughout those years, Joe's greatest disappointment was giving up the Friends of Oak Hill Beautification Fund option on the donation envelope. All donations were designated "Watershed Restoration". Founded by the late Board member Lesley B. McFarland, the Beautification fund was used to purchase flowers, plant trees and generally awe the visitor upon entering the cemetery. The beautification of the ellipse area continued, but Joe dreamed of more color especially in the summer when Oak Hill is verdant, but not colorful. This is the reason I made the Friends of Oak Hill Beautification Fund one of the options for memorial donations when he died.

Joe loved the Oak Hill families. In addition to their being part of our professional life, they are a part of our private life, and many of our discussions revolved around their tragedies. Joe never left the job at the end of the day. As many of you know, he was a jogger, and many times he would return from jogging and say, "I was thinking about the ____ family and their request

for a _____. Maybe we can ask the Board if we can do thus and so for them since there is space, and it would enhance the grounds." By the way, we knew that you also loved us.

We have been thanked in person, in correspondence and to our Board members and by our Board members. Joe was always heartened by your words and they inspired him to do more. He took his responsibility seriously. I always marveled at his work ethic.

So, a new era begins at Oak Hill. Those of us left behind have our work cut out for us. Each day as I look out my office windows at the majestic oaks, I think of how they captured his heart years ago when he was new to Washington.

A taxi brought Joe along R Street on his way to his 35th Street home from Capitol Hill. In just a few blocks from the turn off 28th Street onto R Street, he was awed by the beauty of the cemetery. When he asked the driver its name, he said, "That's Oak Hill, but you'll never get in there."

He did get in, and he is here to stay.

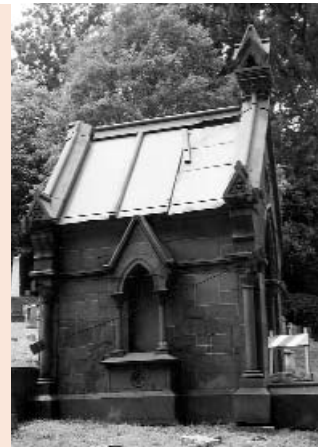
AN APPEAL TO OAK HILL LOT HOLDERS

The historic victorian brownstone mausoleum of the Edward M. Linthicum Family has fallen into severe disrepair and is in imminent danger of collapse. It poses a hazard to surrounding tombs as well as to our groundskeepers and visitors.

The historic structure is believed to be the handiwork of James Renwick, architect of the brownstone Smithsonian "Castle," the Renwick Gallery opposite the White House, and the Oak Hill Chapel and Gatehouse.

Also retiring is Robert L. Walsh, Jr. who served many years as our Treasurer. Mr. Walsh now spends a large part of the year in Maine.

Elizabeth W. Edgeworth (Betsy), our Secretary has also retired after 8 years of enthusiastic service. We are glad that she will continue as a member of the Preservation Foundation.

I am pleased to announce three new Board members. David C. deVicq, Vice President, is an old friend of Oak Hill and a prodigious worker. He has for years been of invaluable assistance in helping to stabilize our terraces and rehabilitate our drainage system. I am so glad to have him because he will be a great asset to the Board of Managers.

We also have a new Secretary Patricia L. McGrath. Mrs. McGrath brings a wealth of knowledge regarding fund raising. She secures money for health care in third world countries. She will be a great help in our fund raising activities through the Foundation.

Still further, George G. Hill is our new Treasurer. Many generations of Mr. Hill's family are buried here. He is a stockbroker and will be invaluable in managing Oak Hill's finances. It is with great enthusiasm that I welcome them to the Board.

The Report of the Treasurer shows in detail the operating income and disbursements during the fiscal year together with a synopsis of the Company's financial resources as of the close of the fiscal year. The Report of the Treasurer shows the endowment fund balance of the Company on May 1, 2005 amounts to \$3,050,238.

There were 45 interments during the fiscal year up from 21 last year bringing total interments to 19,156.

The Bridge Avenue Project which consisted of stabilizing the terrace in that area at a cost of \$606,000 seems to be holding. After the Bridge

Avenue Project was completed, in this fiscal year, we planted the very steep terraces in lirioppe for \$5,962. The lirioppe will help stabilize and improve the appearance of that area. The walkway in this area which had to be rebuilt is standing up well.

The collapsed Carriage House Outfall project was completed last year. Unfortunately, we were unable to secure funds from the Park Service even though this outflow takes care of rain water runoff from Montrose Park. As you know, our drainage system which was constructed in 1849 is showing ravages of time.

In order to conserve our endowment as much as possible, we limited our tree work to the minimum. We now face the task of removing a large oak tree which must be taken down very soon by the chapel. Donations for the tree removal would be greatly appreciated. As those who have visited the cemetery recently know, our roads are in need of substantial repairs which we hope to accomplish this coming year. Donations to this fund would be greatly appreciated.

Our groundskeeping crew continues to keep Oak Hill beautifully maintained. Year in and year out in all kinds of weather, they are working hard for us.

On behalf of the Board of Managers, I want to thank all of those who have given throughout the year. I do want to stress how very important it is that all lot holders give if we want to keep the Cemetery in its present beautiful condition.

We, like all others, are suffering from the decline of the stock market, but in addition, our infrastructure is 156 years old, and our maintenance costs continue to rise.
