\*Elizabeth "Bettie" Duvall Webb, daughter of southern sympathizers, and wife of a northern officer, is described as a Confederate spy. She was a friend of Mary Surratt, the only woman hanged in the assassination of President Lincoln. Bettie was the wife of John Converse Webb, and the couple's three children were born in Minnesota.
