^{*}She was a painter who first studied at the National Cathedral School and at the Corcoran School of Art.

^{**}Herman Hollerith assisted in the taking of the 1880 Federal census. While employed at the Patent Office, he set up a shop in Georgetown to develop machinery to do the tabulating work for the next census, and it was ready and used in 1890. He invented and patented the electric tabulating machine system that used punched cards. His patents revolutionized statistical techniques, and the company he organized in 1896 became the International Business Machines Corporation. In England his punched cards were called Hollerith cards.
